## The Law of Proportion in Genesis

The plot below shows the extent of each section of Genesis from two perspectives: how much time elapses (vertical axis) and how much space in the book the author devotes to it (horizontal axis). The Generations of Heaven and Earth, Ishmael, and Esau are too small to be visible at this scale, and the Generations of the Sons of Noah and of Shem are combined into a single box.

One way that an author focuses attention on an episode is by slowing down the action. In this display, tall thin boxes indicate very rapid advance of action, while wide ones show where the action is slow and thus where the author wants us to pay attention.
