## Why send Israel to a Losing Battle?

James 4:1 From whence come wars and fightings among you? come they not hence, even of your lusts that war in your members? 2 Ye lust, and have not: ye kill, and desire to have, and cannot obtain: ye fight and war, yet ye have not, because ye ask not. 3 **Ye ask, and receive not, because ye ask amiss, that ye may consume it upon your lusts.**

### Two Errors in Prayer: Motive and Grounds

#### 1. Motive: Willfulness

John 7:17 If any man will do his will [wants to do his will], **he shall know** of the doctrine, whether it be of God, or whether I speak of myself.

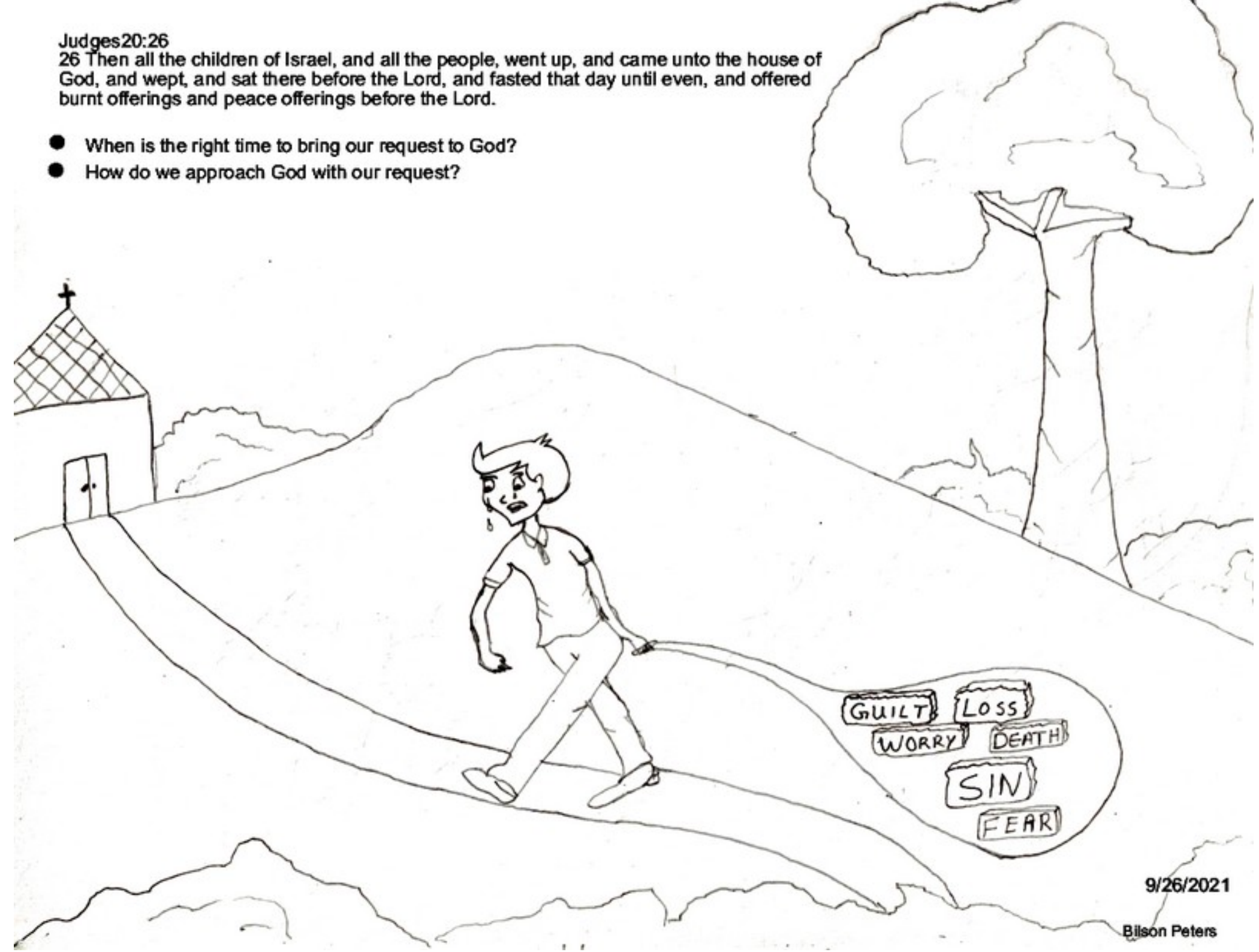
#### 2. Grounds: Not based on God's covenant promises

Joh 14:13 And whatsoever ye shall ask in my name, **that will I do**, that the Father may be glorified in the Son. 14 If ye shall ask any thing in my name, **I will do it.**

Judges 20:26

# Parallels with Joshua 8

- 1) **29, Setting an ambush:** Josh. 8:12 And he took about five thousand men, and set them to lie in ambush between Bethel and Ai, on the west side of the city.
- 2) **30, Main army approaches:** Josh 8:10 And Joshua rose up early in the morning, and numbered the people, and went up, he and the elders of Israel, before the people to Ai. 11 And all the people, even the people of war that were with him, went up, and drew nigh, and came before the city, and pitched on the north side of Ai:
- 3) **31, Enemy is lured out:** Josh 8:14 And it came to pass, when the king of Ai saw it, that they hasted and rose up early, and the men of the city went out against Israel to battle, he and all his people, at a time appointed, before the plain; but he wist not that there were liers in ambush against him behind the city.
- 4) **32-33a, Feigned retreat:** Josh 8:15 And Joshua and all Israel made as if they were beaten before them, and fled by the way of the wilderness. 16 And all the people that were in Ai were called together to pursue after them: and they pursued after Joshua, and were drawn away from the city. 17 And there was not a man left in Ai or Bethel, that went not out after Israel: and they left the city open, and pursued after Israel.
- 5) **33b-34, Ambushers strike:** Josh 8:18 And the LORD said unto Joshua, Stretch out the spear that is in thy hand toward Ai; for I will give it into thine hand. And Joshua stretched out the spear that he had in his hand toward the city. 19 And the ambush arose quickly out of their place, and they ran as soon as he had stretched out his hand:

# Parallels with Joshua 8, cont.

Skipping ahead:

**7) 35, Final Victory:** Josh 8:21 then they turned again, and slew the men of Ai. 22 And the other issued out of the city against them; so they were in the midst of Israel, some on this side, and some on that side: and they smote them, so that they let none of them remain or escape.

Backtracking:

**4) 36, Feigned Retreat**

**5) 37, Ambushers strike**

**6) 38, City burned:** Josh 8:8 And it shall be, when ye have taken the city, that ye shall set the city on fire: according to the commandment of the LORD shall ye do. See, I have commanded you. ... 21 And when Joshua and all Israel saw that the ambush had taken the city, and that the smoke of the city ascended, then they turned again ...

**4) 39, Feigned Retreat**

**6) 40-41, City burned**
