

The Psalms of David's Sin

2 Samuel 11, David sins

2 Sam 12:7 Nathan says to David, "Thou art the man."

2 Sam 12:13a David says to Nathan, "I have sinned against the LORD."

2 Sam 12:13b Nathan says to David, "The LORD also hath put away thy sin; thou shalt not die."

Psa 38:1 O LORD, rebuke me not in thy wrath: neither chasten me in thy hot displeasure. ... 4 For mine iniquities are gone over mine head: as an heavy burden they are too heavy for me. 5 My wounds stink *and* are corrupt because of my foolishness.

Psa 51:1 A Psalm of David, when Nathan the prophet came unto him, after he had gone in to Bathsheba. Have mercy upon me, O God, according to thy lovingkindness: according unto the multitude of thy tender mercies blot out my transgressions.

Psa 32:1 Blessed *is he whose* transgression *is* forgiven, *whose* sin *is* covered. 2 Blessed *is* the man unto whom the LORD imputeth not iniquity, and in whose spirit *there is* no guile.

13 Then will I teach transgressors thy ways ...

Psa 32:8 I will instruct thee and teach thee in the way which thou shalt go: I will guide thee with mine eye. 9 Be ye not as the horse, or as the mule, which have no understanding: whose mouth must be held in with bit and bridle, lest they come near unto thee. 10 Many sorrows shall be to the wicked: but he that trusteth in the LORD, mercy shall compass him about.

Psalm 52, Rebuke of a Gentile sinner

1, Opening Bracket 1a, The wicked **boasts in himself** 1b, God's **eternal** דּוְקָּדָּ

2-3, Accusation of the Wicked

4-5, Doom of the Wicked

6-8, Contrast with the Righteous

8b-9, Closing Bracket 8b, God's eternal קָּדָּ 9, The righteous praises God 1Sa 21:7 Now a certain man of the servants of Saul was there that day, detained before the LORD; and his name was **Doeg, an Edomite**, the chiefest of the herdmen that belonged to Saul.

1Sa 22:8 [Saul said] there is none of you that is sorry for me, or sheweth unto me that my son hath stirred up my servant against me, to lie in wait, as at this day? 9 Then answered **Doeg the Edomite**, which was set over the servants of Saul, and said, I saw the son of Jesse coming to Nob, to Ahimelech the son of Ahitub. 10 And he enquired of the LORD for him, and gave him victuals, and gave him the sword of Goliath the Philistine.

Links to Psalms 1, 2, 49

Psalm 49

6 They that trust in their wealth, and boast themselves in the multitude of their riches;

14 Like sheep they are laid in the grave; death shall feed on them; and the upright shall have dominion over them in the morning; and their beauty shall consume in the grave from their dwelling.

Psalm 52

1 Why boastest thou thyself in mischief, O mighty man?

5 God shall likewise destroy thee for ever, he shall take thee away, and pluck thee out of thy dwelling place, and root thee out of the land of the living.

6 The righteous also shall see, and fear, and shall laugh at him:

7 Lo, this is the man that made not God his strength; but trusted in the abundance of his riches, and strengthened himself in his wickedness.

8 But I am like a green olive tree in the house of God:

Psalms 1-2

1:3 And he shall be like a tree planted by the rivers of water, that bringeth forth his fruit in his season; his leaf also shall not wither; and whatsoever he doeth shall prosper.

2:4 He that sitteth in the heavens shall laugh: the Lord shall have them in derision.
