



6-8, God speaks 6-7, Cities of Israel 8, Gentile territories

9-12, David speaks: Confidence 9-11, to God 12, to the people



Helpful References on Psalm 60:1


60:1 ... when he strove with **Aram**zobah, when Joab returned, and smote of **Edom** in **the valley of salt** twelve thousand.

Two Fulfillments of Psalm 60:9-12

9 Who will bring me into the strong city? who will lead me into Edom? ... 12 Through God we shall do valiantly: for he it is that shall tread down (בוּס) our enemies.

1Ki 11:15 For it came to pass, when David was in Edom, and Joab the captain of the host was gone up to bury the slain, after he had smitten every male in Edom; 16 (For six months did Joab remain there with all Israel, until he had cut off every male in Edom:) 17 That Hadad fled, ...

Isa 63:1 Who is this that cometh from Edom, with dyed garments from Bozrah? this that is glorious in his apparel, travelling in the greatness of his strength?
