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
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# Important Facts about Ephesus

18:1-3, 18-22; 1 Cor 16:8, 19; Rom 16:3; 2 Tim 4:19	Ephesus has <b>many transient visitors</b> (like Aquilla and Priscilla).		
18:24-26; 19:1-7	The church was exposed to believers with a <b>diversity of beliefs</b> .		
19:8-10, 20, 23-28, 35-37	The city is fanatically devoted to the <b>goddess Diana</b> and hosted her <b>temple</b> , with its sacred park and tree.		
20:1-3, 15-16	The city is <b>losing its leading position</b> through the silting of its harbor.		
20:17, 29-35	The church has <b>functioning elders</b> .		
Ephesians (vs. 1 Cor.)	The church is <b>theologically mature</b> .		
20:29-30; 1 Tim 1:3; 6:3	The church was continually threatened by <b>false teachers</b>		



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### Helpful Verses in the Background of Ephesus

Timothy's ministry in Ephesus

1Ti 1:3 As I besought thee to abide still at **Ephesus**, when I went into Macedonia, that thou mightest charge some that they **teach no other doctrine**, 4 Neither give heed to fables and endless genealogies, which minister questions, rather than godly edifying which is in faith: so do.

1Ti 6:3 If any man teach otherwise, and **consent not to wholesome words**,

even the words of our Lord Jesus Christ, and to the doctrine which is according to godliness; 4 He is proud, knowing nothing, but doting about questions and strifes of words, whereof cometh envy, strife, railings, evil surmisings, 5 Perverse disputings of men of corrupt minds, and destitute of the truth, **supposing that gain is godliness**: from such withdraw thyself.

2:1 "thy works"

Rom 12:5 So we, being many, are one body in Christ, and every one members one of another.

1Co 10:17 For we being many are one bread, and one body: for we are all partakers of that one bread.

1Co 12:12 For as the body is one, and hath many members, and all the members of that one body, being many, are one body: so also is Christ.

Deu 6:4 Hear [singular], O Israel: The LORD our God is one LORD: 5 And thou shalt love the LORD thy God with all thine heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy might.
